

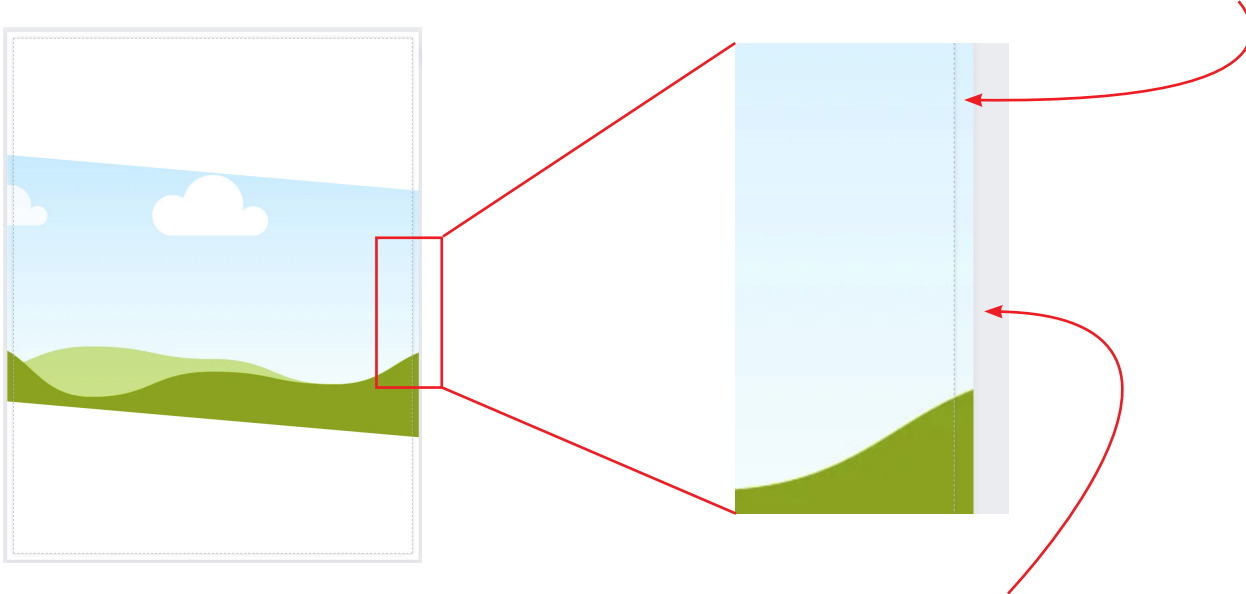
How to Save a Canva File as a PDF File

Open your Canva file.

First, let's make sure your Canva file has the correct bleed extended on all sides.

To see the bleed on your document go to **File** and **View Settings** and click on **Show Print Bleed**.

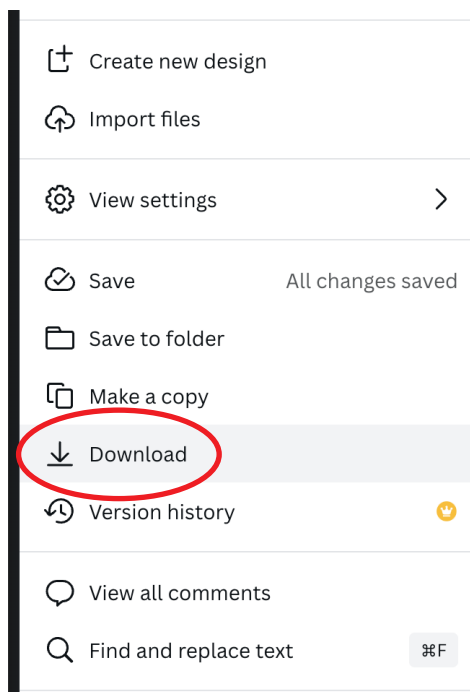
You will now see a gray dashed line. **THIS IS THE FINAL CUT EDGE OF YOUR DOCUMENT.**



All photos, shapes, elements and colors need to extend **PAST** this line and into the outer white area. This is the document **BLEED**.

Next we want to export a PDF that includes this bleed.


Go to **File** and click on **Download**.




In the next box use the following settings.

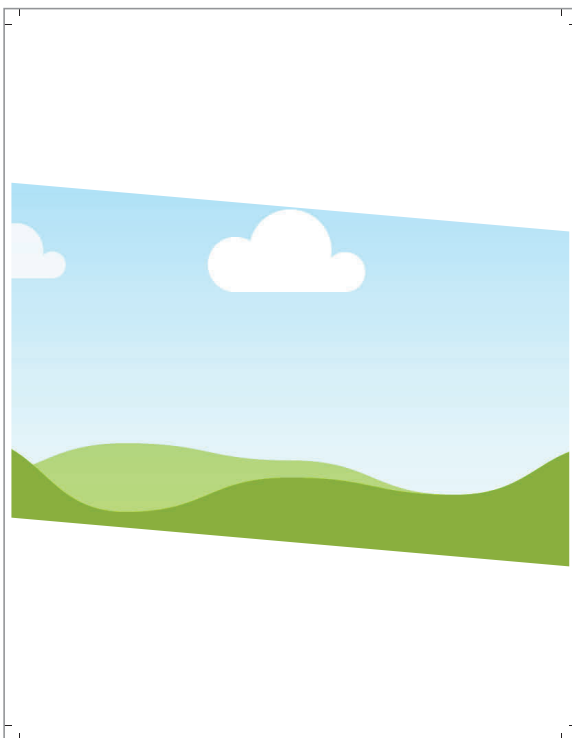

Please select CMYK for the color profile if possible. RGB color is not recommended as it is not used for printing and can cause a color shift in the final printed piece.

Once all settings match above, click **Download**.



Your final PDF will look like this with marks in all corners and the image extending past the trim lines.
